RALEIGH, (SGRToday.com) - Gordon Food Service will build a new distribution center in Cabarrus County, bringing 275 new jobs and a \$58 million investment over the next five years.

Salaries will vary by job function and experience, but the average annual payroll for the new jobs is expected to be \$12.3 million when all the new jobs are added, according to the state's job announcement.

The Michigan-based company is North America's largest privately-held, family-managed broadline foodservice distributor. Founded in 1897, Gordon Food Service distributes to foodservice operators within the Midwest, Northeast, Southeast, and Southwest regions of the United States and coast-to-coast in Canada.

"I am so happy to welcome Gordon Food Service to North Carolina," said Commerce Secretary Sharon Decker in a statement. "This is the type of company we want to continue to recruit to our state; a company that offers good paying jobs and has a strong tradition of doing business the right way."

The project was made possible in part by a performance-based grant from the One North Carolina Fund of up to \$500,000. T
