

Fayetteville Woman Gets 12 Years In Federal Prison For Sex Trafficking

Daquanjra Tasha White, 29, of Fayetteville, was sentenced by United States Senior District Judge Malcolm J. Howard for sex trafficking of children. Judge Howard sentenced White to 12 years of imprisonment followed by 5 years of supervised release. White was charged in a four-count indictment on February 8, 2017, and pled guilty to one count on February 5, 2018.

Between November 2015 and January 2016, White prostituted three minor females in Fayetteville and Raleigh, North Carolina. She recruited the children on social media and arranged to meet them. She then took provocative photos of them and advertised them for prostitution online. White received proceeds from the girls' prostitution.

The investigation of this case was conducted by the Fayetteville Police Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The case was handled by Assistant United States Attorney Erin Blondel for the Government.
